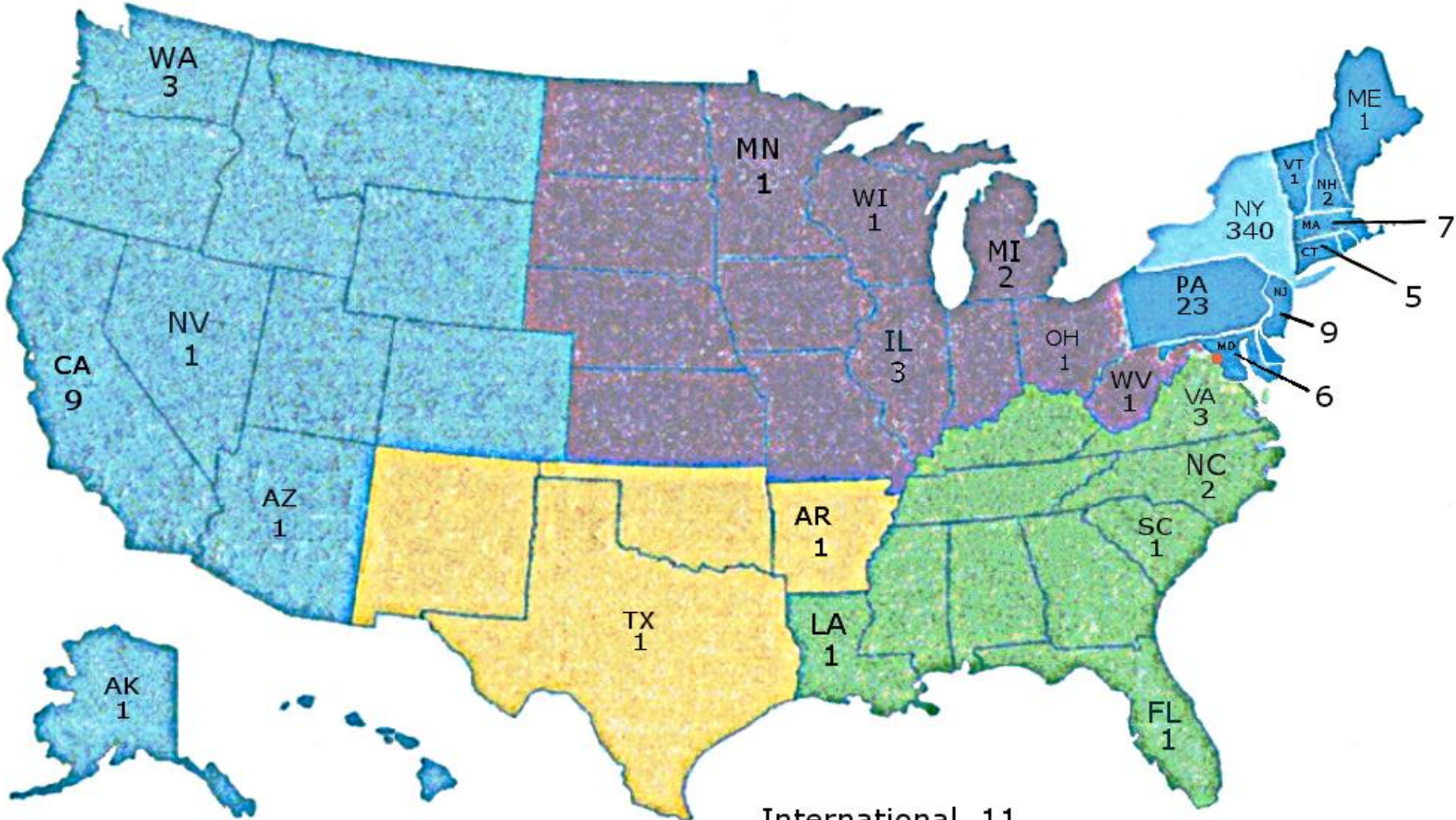

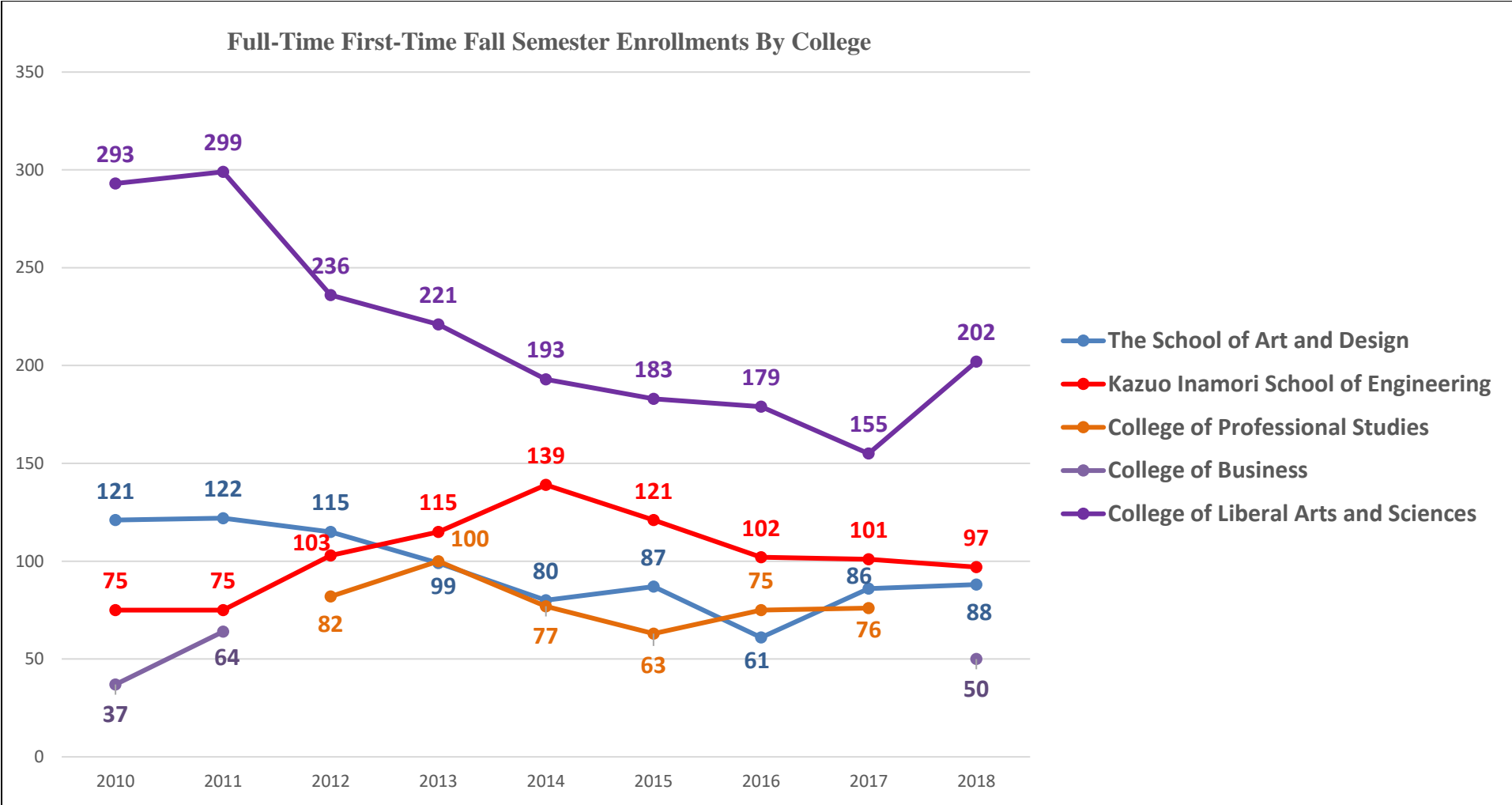

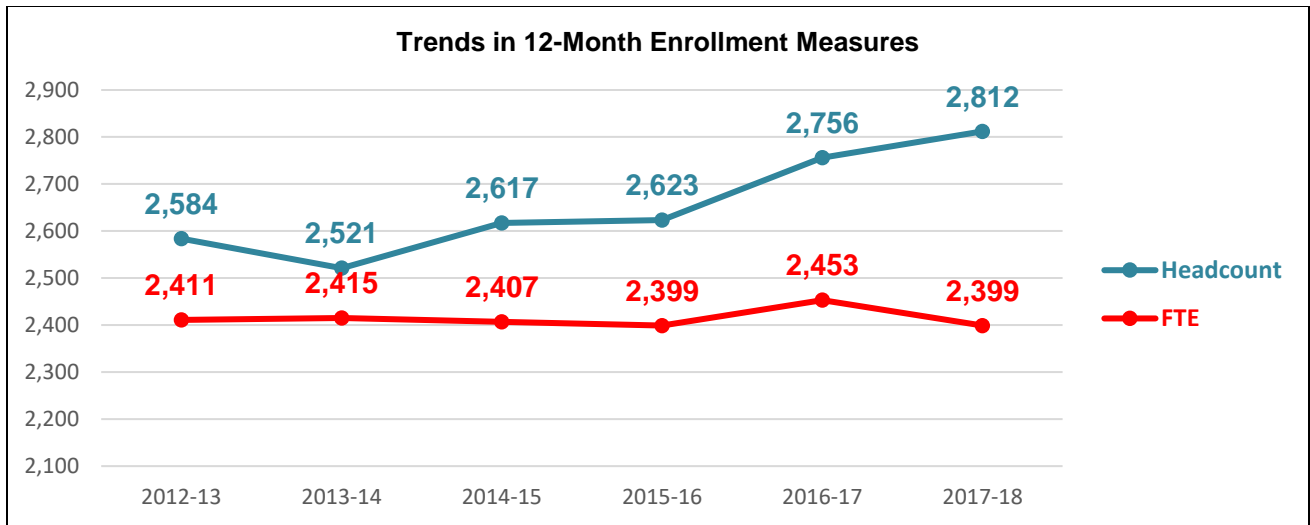

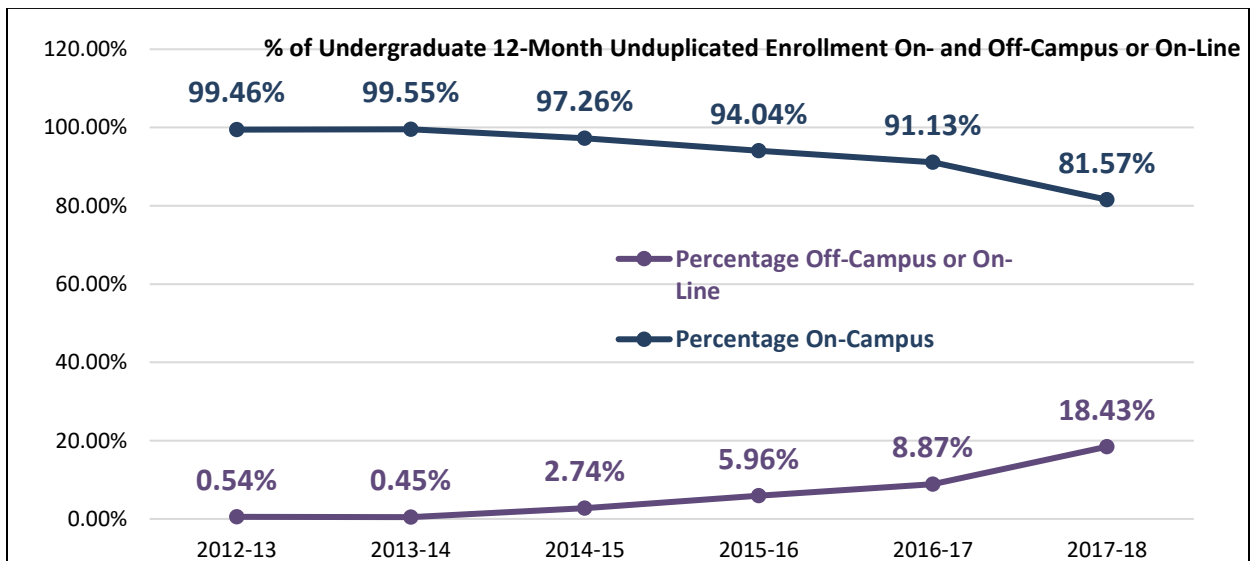

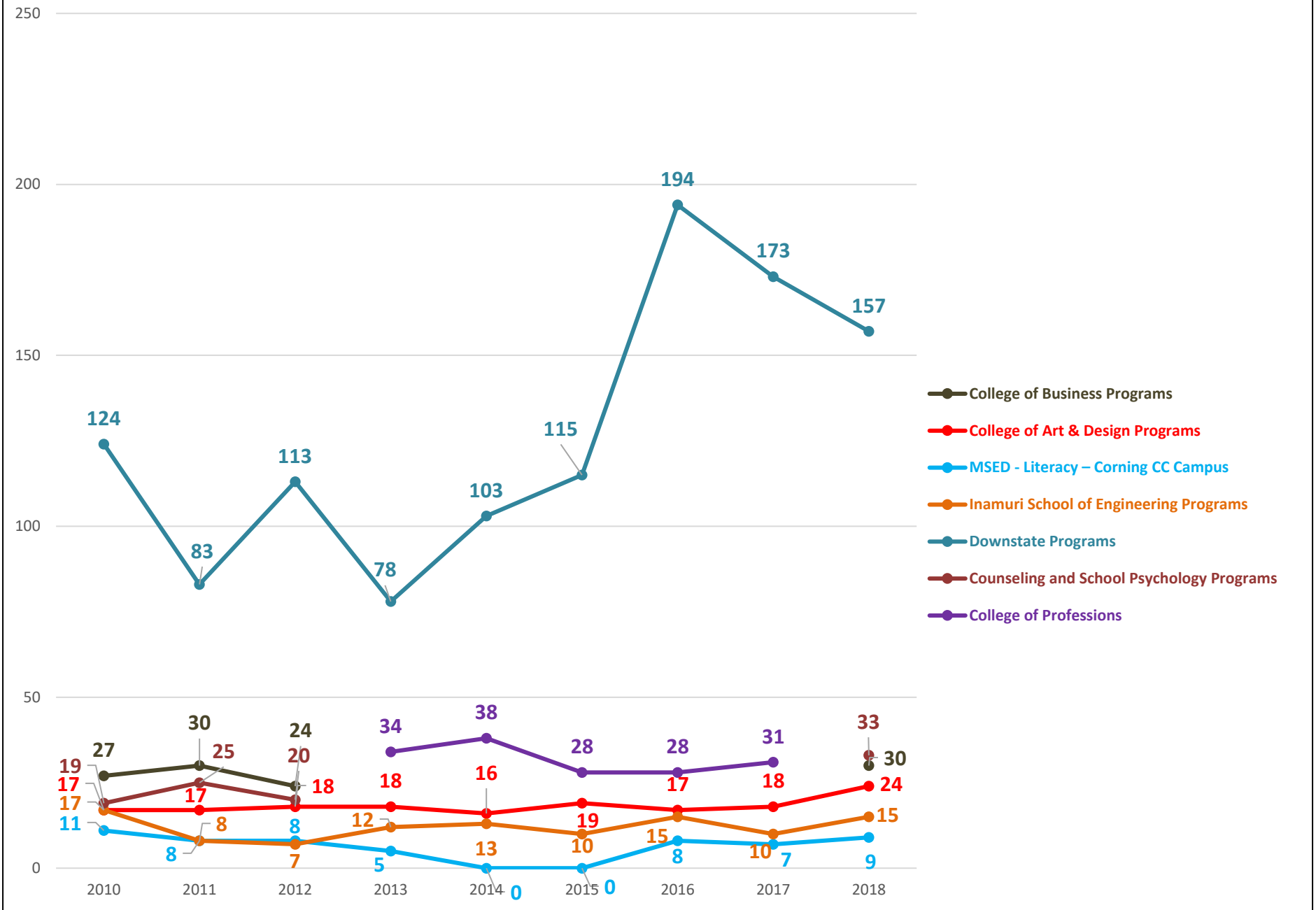

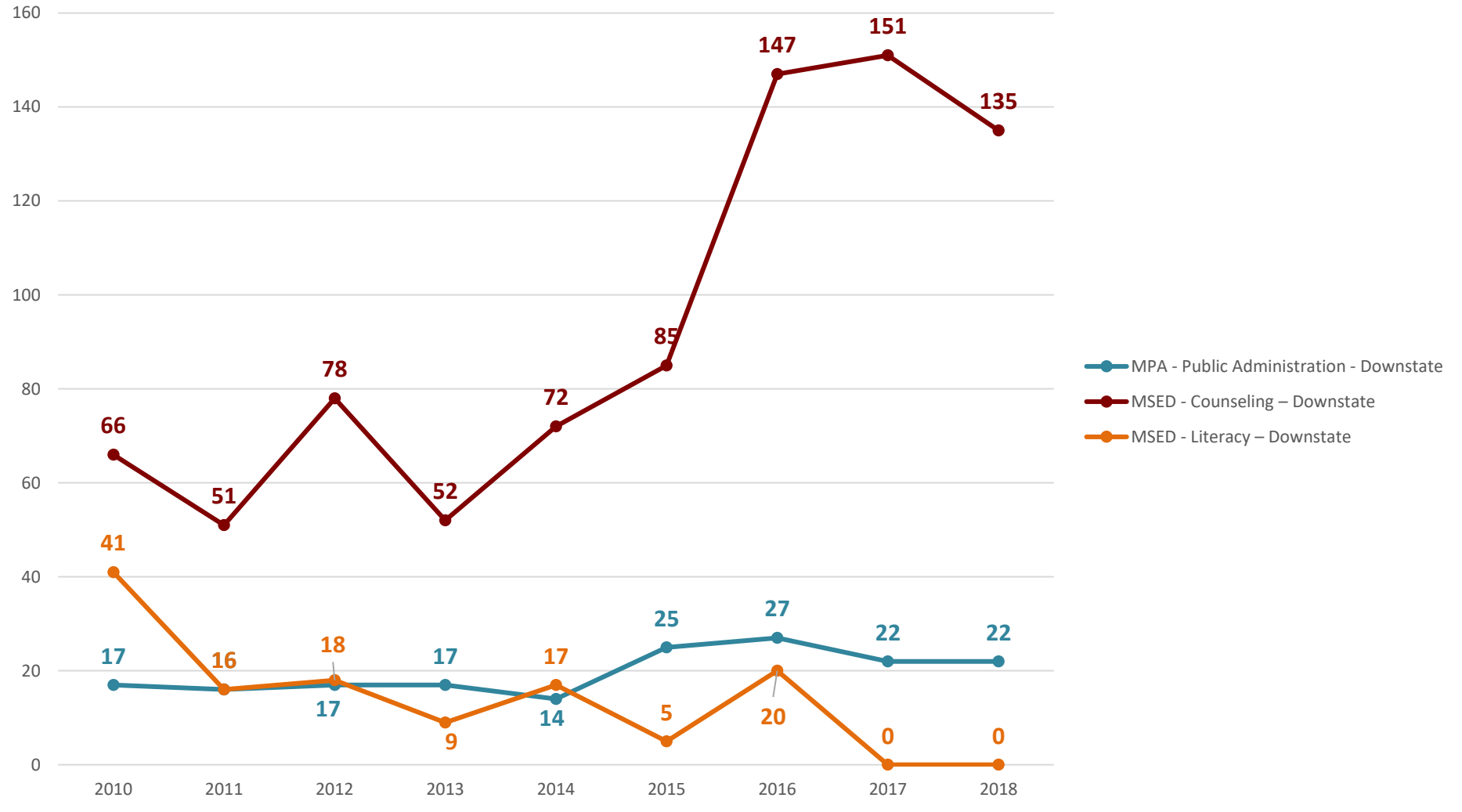

Graduate Enrollment by Academic Division – Fall Semesters

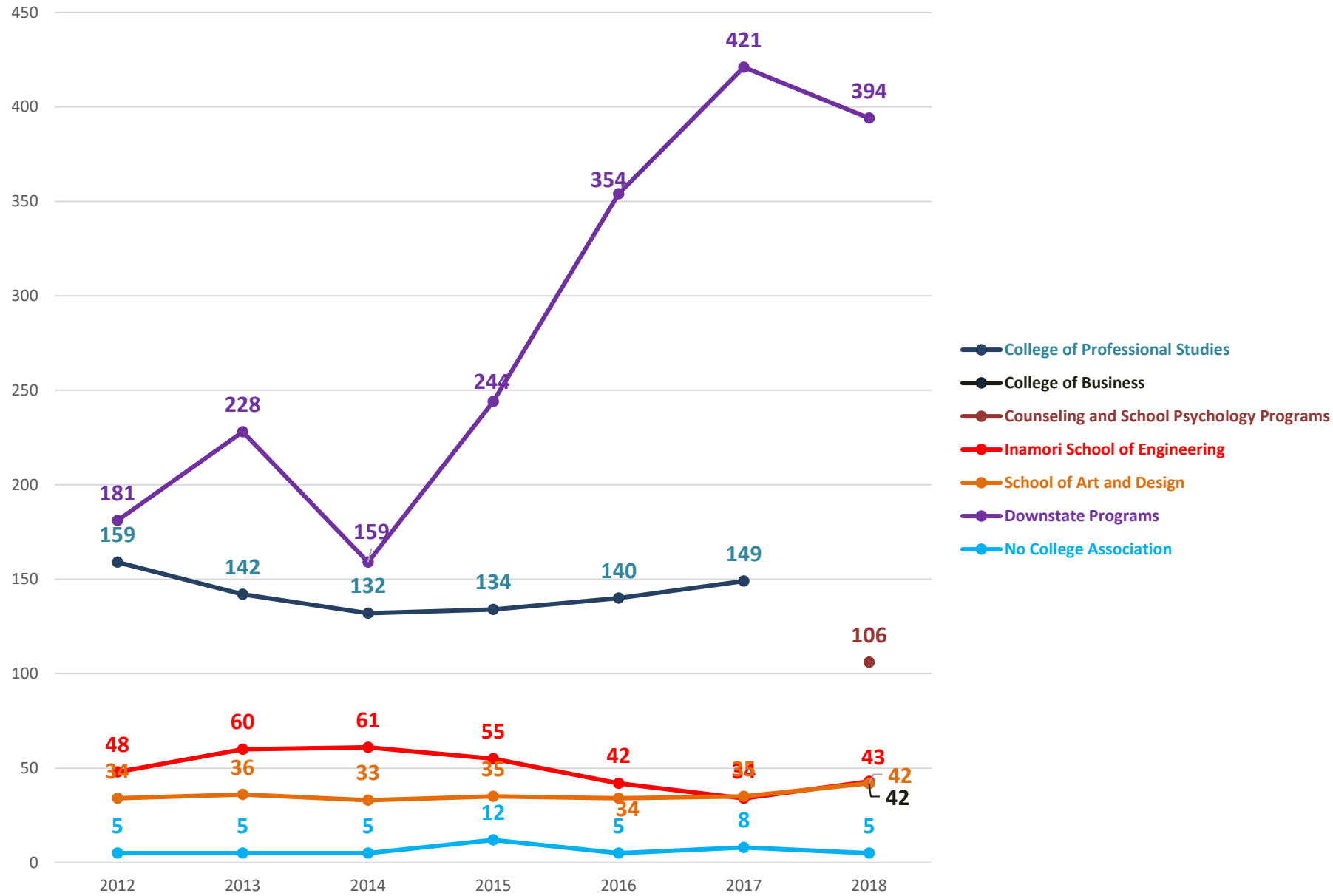

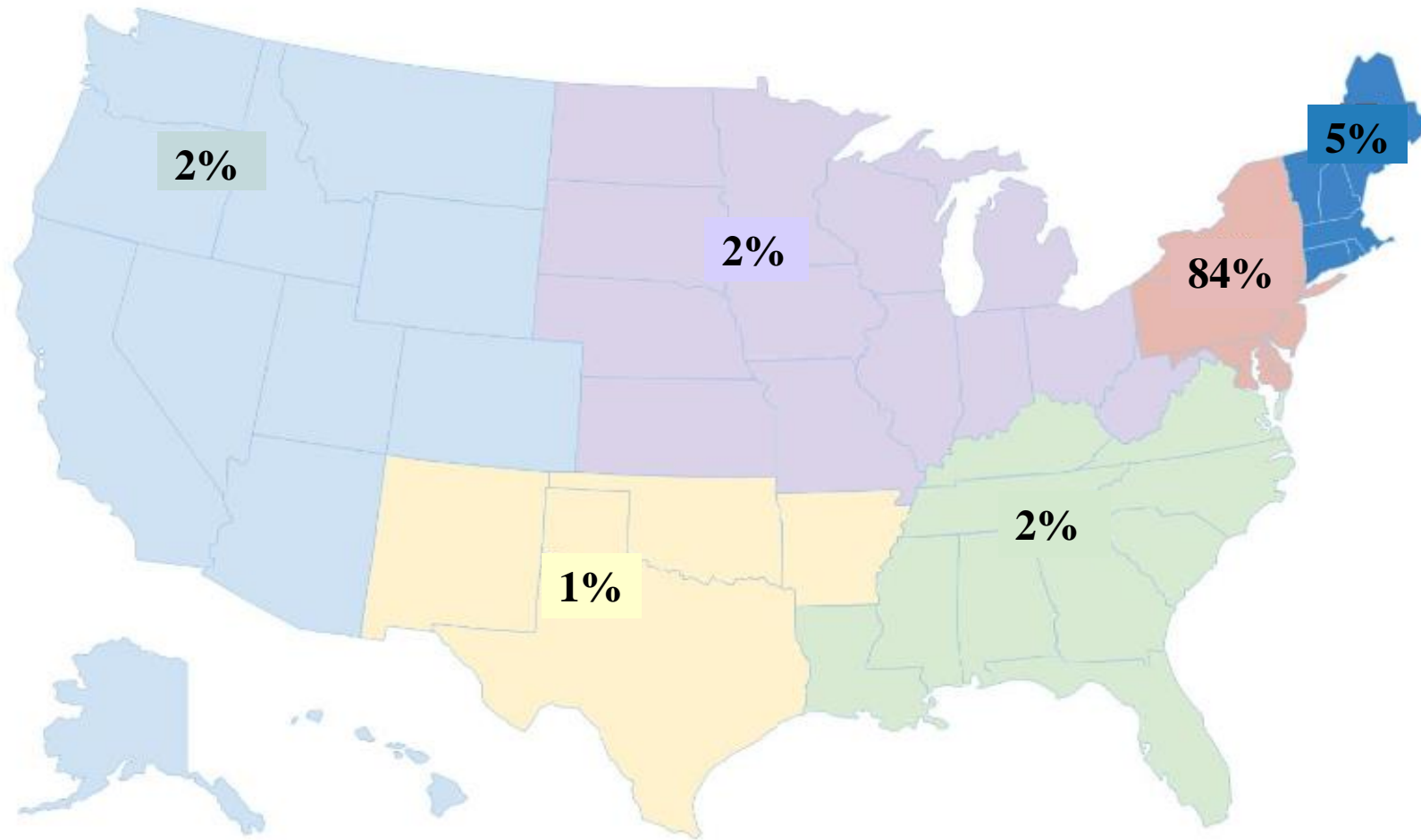

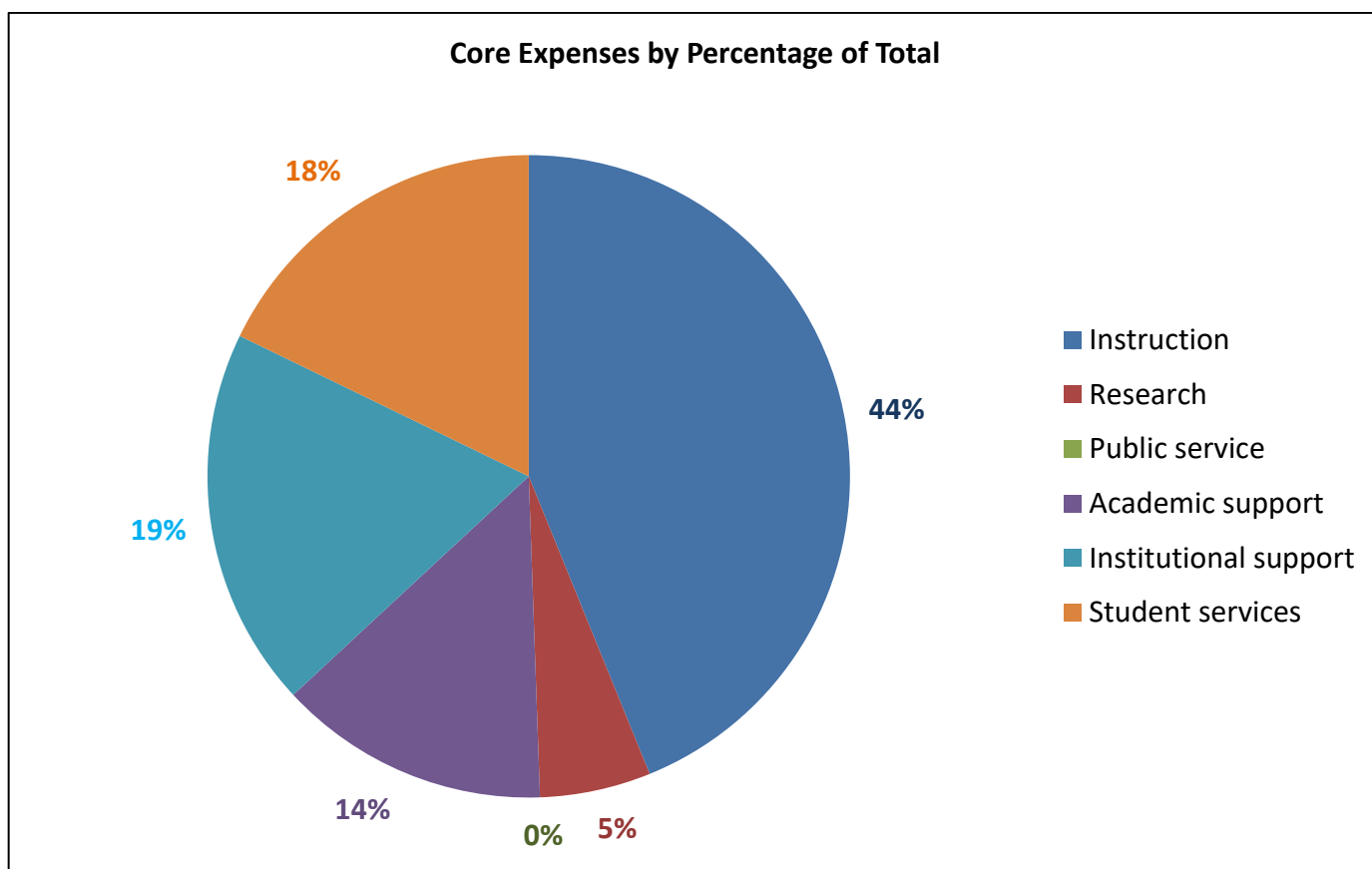
