INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS

Thank you for your interest in the Graduate School at Alfred University. The following instructions will help guide you through the application process. If you have any questions about the process, you can contact the Office of Graduate Admissions anytime.

You can also apply to Alfred University using our online application at www.alfred.edu/gradschool.

ADMISSIONS POLICY

The University admits students to our graduate programs who hold four-year baccalaureate degrees from accredited colleges or universities and demonstrate the ability to perform credibly at the graduate level. Applicant qualifications are judged by the faculty of the department of program to which they apply and by the Director of Graduate Studies.

Each successful applicant is admitted into a program leading to an advanced degree, and expected to follow a planned course of study (within the degree of flexibility set forth in Alfred University program descriptions). On occasion, otherwise well-qualified students are admitted provisionally to degree programs for which their undergraduate careers have prepared them inadequately. Such students must take the requisite undergraduate courses, without graduate credit, before being admitted to full graduate standing.

Applicants who do not satisfy the customary requirements, but who demonstrate promise in some way, are sometimes admitted provisionally, with enrollment in a degree program decided on the basis of one semester of work.

NON-DEGREE STUDENTS

The Graduate School recognizes the desire or need of college graduates to enroll for a limited number of graduate courses without any wish to attain an advanced degree. A maximum of twelve credit hours is permitted on this basis. Students who wish to take courses without first matriculating into a graduate program need not apply for admission, but should contact the Student Service Center in Seidlin Hall for information about registration (607-871-2123).

Credit hours earned “non-degree” before admission to an Alfred University graduate degree program may or may not be applicable toward the degree sought. If denied admission, the applicant may not register for further non-degree graduate work. Non-degree study is not permitted in graduate Art or Art History courses during the Fall and Spring semesters.

Those who already possess an advanced degree may earn more than twelve credit hours on a non-degree basis.

- Complete the enclosed Application for Graduate Admission. You may also complete our online application at www.alfred.edu/gradschool. Return the application along with a \$60 nonrefundable application fee. Your check or money order should be payable to Alfred University.
- Provide official transcripts of all previous work at the college level, including proof you hold a four-year baccalaureate degree.
- Request two letters of recommendation addressing your ability to succeed in the program to which you are applying. Applicants to either the M.A./C.A.S or Psy.D. programs in School Psychology, the on-campus M.S.Ed in Counseling program, or the Ph.D. in Engineering programs must submit an additional letter of recommendation for a total of three letters. Please use the enclosed Reference Report form to make the necessary number of copies.
- Applicants to the Psy.D. program must include a Statement of Research Interest in addition to the Statement of Intent.
- MFA applicants are required to submit a portfolio of 20 images by January 15. The portfolio must be submitted in digital format. No slides will be accepted.

Ceramic Art and Sculpture/Dimensional Studies: MFA applicants may submit the required portfolio of 20 images either online (via SlideRoom) or by sending digital images on a CD or DVD. Detail images count toward the total of 20. Please contact the Graduate Admissions Office with questions regarding portfolio submission.

Electronic Integrated Arts: The portfolio may be submitted using SlideRoom, disc/tape, or a combination of both. Please note that SlideRoom does not support the submission of interactive works, animation, or videos over 60 MB. Links to websites and online pieces may be posted to SlideRoom. MFA-EIA applicants working primarily with video are encouraged to submit the portfolio on disc or tape for the best presentation of your work. Please contact the Graduate Admissions Office with questions regarding portfolio submission.

Submission via SlideRoom (alfred.slideroom.com)

Applicants may upload images (JPEG), video (mov, wmv, flv), music (MP3), or PDF documents. For good image quality and fast upload, image files should be sized with a maximum dimension of 1024px @72dpi. Please keep video files under 60MB. There is a nominal, non-refundable fee for this service. SlideRoom's online portal offers additional instructions for submitting work. Submission on Disc

MFA applicants submitting images on disc should use the following recommendations, by program:

ELECTRONIC INTEGRATED ARTS - Depending on an individual's work, a portfolio may be a combination of the following digital files:

- Prints, videos, animations, sound pieces, interactive works, installations, websites, or other appropriate work.
- Excerpts from longer video or sound works are strongly encouraged, along with complete works when appropriate.

Powerpoint and Keynote are acceptable formats for MFA-EIA portfolios submitted on disc. Acceptable file types include:

- For audio works: AIFF, WAVE, MP3 on disc.
- For video works: mov, wmv, flv, MPEG4 on disc; Mini DV or HDDV tapes.
- For digital prints, we recommend JPEG files, sized no greater than 1MB per file on disc.

CERAMIC ART

- Files should be submitted in JPEG format and clearly labeled: Number_Title_Name_Year.
- Submit a hard copy numbered list of images with dimensions.
- Slides or images in PowerPoint, iPhoto libraries, or similar programs will not be accepted.
- Clearly label the disc with your name and year of application. Avoid adhesive labels.

SCULPTURE/DIMENSIONAL STUDIES

- PowerPoint and iPhoto libraries are not accepted.
- Files should be submitted in JPEG format and clearly labeled: Number_Title_Name_Year.
- Include an image list (hardcopy and/or pdf) with the following information: image number, title, dimensions, material, date, and any description necessary to illuminate the work.
- If video documentation is important for your work, you may include a DVD of QuickTime movies.

The portfolio may be submitted with the application or separately.

Send disc(s) in a crush-resistant container. If you wish to have your portfolio returned, a self-addressed, postage-paid envelope must be included with the portfolio. Please do not send the only copy of your portfolio. All portfolio materials will be handled with great care, but neither the School of Art and Design nor the Graduate Admissions Office takes responsibility for loss or damage.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

English Proficiency Testing

International applicants who do not hold a baccalaureate or Master's degree from a U.S. institution must submit official results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS).

Graduate Record of Examination (GRE)

Applicants to M.A./C.A.S. or Psy.D. degree programs in School Psychology or the M.S.Ed degree program in School Psychology, or the M.S.Ed degree program in Counseling must submit official scores from the general section of the Graduate Record of Examination (GRE). There is no minimum score requirement. Applicants to graduate programs in Engineering are encouraged, but not required, to submit GRE scores. There is no minimum score requirement.

Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT)

Applicants to the M.B.A. (Master of Business Administration) degree program must submit an official GMAT score report. There is no minimum score requirement.

Interview

Applicants to the Counseling, School Psychology, and Education programs are required to have an on-campus interview. Interviews for applicants to the M.F.A. degree programs are optional, and are offered only during the fall semester while classes are in session. Please contact the Art Office at 607-871-2442 to schedule an interview for the M.F.A. program.

Transfer Credit

Due consideration will be given to graduate work done at other accredited institutions, and some transfer of credits may be permitted in most programs. Such credits must be in courses that were clearly at the graduate level with a grade of B or better, and appropriate to the student's Alfred University program of study. Additionally, transfer credits must fit within the six consecutive calendar years of a student's academic program. The student's advisor and program department chair or program director must approve each credit transfer. The maximum number of credits that may be transferred is six semester credit hours in any of the programs leading to a master's degree, and twenty credit

hours in any doctoral program. (No transfer of credit is permitted in the M.F.A. program.) Furthermore, no more than six credits used to satisfy the requirements of one graduate degree program may be used toward the satisfaction of any other Alfred University graduate program. Grades earned in courses transferred from other institutions do not affect the Alfred University grade point average.

The Graduate School

In 1938, the Board of Trustees of Alfred University established the Graduate Division of the College of Liberal Arts. This action was motivated by both a desire to implement and encourage research and a concern for the improved training of secondary school teachers. In time it became apparent that the growing needs for advanced work in the geographic area served by Alfred University demanded an organization educationally and administratively more functional than the graduate division. Therefore, in 1947, the Board of Trustees established the Graduate School of Alfred University.

Today, the Graduate Council administers and guides all graduate programs throughout the University, providing unity and direction for graduate study.

Alfred University graduate students are enrolled in five master's and two doctoral degree programs with numerous areas of specialization. Admission is selective, ensuring all graduate students are intellectually and academically outstanding. Student quality and the intimate size of each program create an intellectually stimulating and challenging academic environment on a personal scale.

Alfred is known for the quality and diversity of its academic and professional programs – usually expected only of large universities – within a personalized, intimate setting, normally found in small colleges.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Students born after December 31, 1956 must provide written documentation of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella, as required by New York State Public Health Law 2165. Students who do not comply with this state law will be withdrawn from the University and will not be permitted to attend classes. Questions regarding this requirement, or any other aspects of student health services, may be directed to the Wellness Center at 607-871-2400.

DINING

The University operates four dining facilities on campus. Two of the four facilities, Ade Hall and the Powell Campus Center Dining Hall, serve breakfast, lunch and dinner. These two dining halls primarily serve Alfred University students on a University meal plan, but may be used on a cash basis for single meals.

The other two dining facilities, the Li'l Alf CyberFresh Café, located in the Powell Campus Center, and MidKnight Express, located on the ground floor of Ade Hall, feature fast-food, à la carte entrees and daily lunch specials. These facilities are open for both early morning and late night customers and operate on a cash or dining dollars basis.
