Alfred University equestrian camps offer a wonderful opportunity for all levels of riders from beginners through advanced to define and achieve their personal riding goals during an exciting, fun-filled week. Campers can bring their own horses or use AU's great lesson horses during their week of camp. They'll ride and care for their horse throughout the week as they refine their skills. All camps are held at AU's Bromeley-Daggett Equestrian Center. This spacious equestrian center includes classrooms, viewing areas, a 200 x 80-foot indoor arena, 50 stalls and two outdoor arenas: 200 x 100 and 80 x 100.

RESIDENTIAL ENGLISH CAMP

The Residential English Camp, a week-long overnight camp for riders aged 14-17, accommodates hunt seat riding based on the gifts and needs of the participants. Campers have lots of fun, refine their skills and have plenty of time to get to know the horses and each other! We work with campers individually to help them define realistic personal goals at the beginning of the week and their lessons are then directed toward helping them achieve those goals. Campers arrive on Sunday and leave after lunch on Saturday. We do flat work in the morning and ride over fences in the afternoon. In the evening we vary the schedule, including a trip to the County Fair, a campfire and fun at Foster Lake, more time for riding and a selection of group recreational activities.

Cost: \$875— Enrollment deadline: June 1, 2012

The camp fee covers room and board from supper on Sunday through lunch on Saturday, instruction, supervision, program materials, recreational activities, T-shirt, and either the use of an AU horse or the boarding of the camper's own horse. Campers stay in University residence halls (2 per room) and provide their own pillows, blankets and bed/bath linens for the week (bed linens must fit the extra-long twin residence hall beds). All-you-can eat, cafeteria-style meals are served in the campus dining hall. *(We can accommodate most food allergies and special requirements if notified in advance.)*

A student show is held at the end of the week to allow riders to demonstrate the skills they have learned to their parents, instructors and other AU staff.

Residential Camp Enrollment Procedure

The preferred, full-size enrollment form is available online at www.alfred.edu/summer/camps/equestrian.cfm. (A smaller version is attached for those who do not have ready access to a computer.) Campers who wish to attend should return the completed enrollment form, along with the camp fee, by June 1, 2012. Payment can be made by check or credit card. Campers will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. The camp will fill up fast, so it is a good idea to enroll as early as possible. We'll begin accepting enrollment forms January 3.

Campers who enroll will soon receive further information and additional materials including medical history forms, permission forms, emergency notification forms, etc. These must be filled out as soon as possible and must be back in our hands by June 29. Updated immunization information is also required at that time. If you do not have this information on hand, you may want to acquire this from your physician now to avoid processing delays.

Residential Camp Cancellation Policy

Refunds, minus a \$100 administrative fee, will be made for residential camper cancellations received by June 29. 50% refunds will be made for cancellations received between June 30 and July 6. Sorry, no refunds can be issued after July 6.

DAY CAMPS

The Alfred University Equestrian Day Camps, June 25-28 and July 23-26, are open to riders of all levels, aged 8-16. The camps will run from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday. **English and western instruction will be offered during the first week, but only western instruction is available the week of July 23-26.** Each camper will be assigned a horse to ride during the week and will also be involved with the hands-on care for that horse. Campers will have 2 sessions of riding each day.

When campers are not involved in riding they will be busy with arts and crafts projects and other recreational activities as well as learning stable management skills. A horse show will be held at the end of the day on Thursday so campers can demonstrate for their parents the skills they learned during the week.

Each camper will be responsible for packing his/her own lunch. Refreshments and snacks will be provided. A kitchen area is available for use. Campers may bring their own horses if desired. **Cost: \$350 per week. Enrollment deadlines: June 15 for 1st week; July 13 for 2nd week.**
